**September 7 — Hunter Safety Training Workshop**

**September 18 — Astronomy Night – "Fall Constellations"**

**September 20 - 21 — Archaeology, Rocks & Minerals Weekend and Fossil Dig**  
Be dazzled by the beauty of minerals and fossils from all over the world. Take in displays, a silent auction, films, gold panning and a digging table. **September 27 - 28 — Migration Festival**  
Imagine hundreds of thousands of geese honking in the marsh all at once! This weekend is traditionally one of the best times during fall migration to hear and see this spectacular natural event. Horse-drawn wagon rides on Saturday and Sunday from 12:30 to 4:30 p.m.
